Moreover, the warm and welcoming villagers inhabiting Tamang, Buddhists, Sherpa, Gurung, and Chhetri of this place present themselves to uphold their customers and offer a glimpse into a world untouched by time.

This virgin gem of Nepal is also recognized as Beyul Kyimolung, which refers to the Valley of Happiness. The magnificent and soaring Ganesh Himal and its snow-capped peak are the centerpieces of the valley. Manaslu Tsum Valley is a transcendent beauty of verdant forests and meadows.
