

Mera Peak Climbing



Trip Overview

Mera Peak located in the Sagarmatha National Park region, is a challenging peak to climb. At an elevation of 6,476 m, the peak is the strenuous difficulty level to conquer. Crossing the Zatrwa La Pass at 5,555 meters, encountering Sherpa culture, and learning mountaineering skills to summit Mera Peak, the experience is beyond explanation.

Technical climbing of Mera Peak required adjustments to cold weather conditions, long exhausting days of steep climbing, and the use of fixed ropes, crampons, and ice axes. Good fitness and stamina level is required, while a certain level of trekking experience at high altitude would help you make the most of Mera Peak climbing expeditions.

1. What is the Mera peak climbing cost?

Based on average cost, the Mera peak climbing cost ranges from USD 2,500 to USD 3,000. Even, you can opt for luxury and deluxe packages, among which, the climbing permit varies on a seasonal basis, i.e. USD 250 (spring), USD 125 (autumn), and USD 70 (winter and summer).

2. How difficult is Mera peak climbing?

Mera Peak climbing includes alpine grade, glacier crossing, and technical difficulty demanding a certain level of mountaineering skills. Expect to walk 5 to 6 hours each day, acclimatize to high altitudes, and tackle with good endurance and physical fitness.

3. Is Mera Peak harder than Island Peak climbing?

In comparison to Island Peak, Mera Peak has more risk of altitude sickness, because of its higher elevation of 6476 m, greater than 6,186 m. Even, technical difficulty is greater in the case of Mera peak climbing.

4. Can one see Everest from Mera Peak?

Mera Peak does offer a close-up view of Mount Everest, that is unobstructed. Even other majestic mountains like Lhotse, Makalu, Cho Oyu, and Kanchenjunga, are seen from Mera Peak.

5. Can beginners ascend on Mera Peak climbing?

Mera peak climbing has a majority portion of non-technical terrain, well-defined trails, and gradual elevation gain, which can be suitable even for beginners with reasonable tips from guides, and mental fortitude. Learning basic mountaineering skills and preparing for unpredictable desires can help beginners ascend Mera Peak climbing.
